
The Baker House 1650

Considered to be the finest bed and breakfast in the Hamptons, The Baker House 1650 is located on Main Street in the historic East Hampton Village. The 17th century Cotswold-inspired architecture possesses a refined experience for guests with stunning modern accommodations and conveniences. These include a daily gourmet seated breakfast, a grand family room, and of course The Baker Spa just downstairs from the main level.

The Baker Spa includes a hydra jacuzzi soaking tub, eucalyptus steam shower, sauna, and endless swimming pool. Note that use of the spa is exclusive for guests of The Baker House 1650.

Outside, guests can explore the stunning English gardens and relax during the summer months in their infinity-edge pool. During the summer, complimentary parking passes are available for the nearby East Hampton Village Beaches. Guests may also bring provided Frette beach towels, umbrellas, and chairs to the beach.

In-room amenities include a Bose iPod Dock, On-Demand & DVD player, iron & ironing board, purified heat and air conditioning, and Frette guest slippers and robes.

Guests aged 10 years and older are welcome to stay at The Baker House.

Baron's Cove

Located in the historic village of Sag Harbor, Baron's Cove features a nautically inspired hotel lobby, bar and lounge with cozy wood burning fireplaces. Just outside the lounge is a breezy front porch and stunning side veranda. This seaside hotel is also home to a classic all-American restaurant. Baron's Cove boasts sweeping views of the Sag Harbor Marina and is home to one of the best sunset views in the Hamptons.

This Hamptons resort has 67 luxurious rooms that include rooms with a private garden terrace, harbor loft suites with balconies, village rooms, and <u>dog-friendly rooms</u>.

Family friendly amenities include their heated saltwater pool, tennis court, fitness studio, spa services, summer culinary events, and complimentary beach service with transportation, and more.

Baron's Cove is the only venue in Sag Harbor featuring live entertainment every night during the summer season. The hotel, just a short walk from Main Street, is open year-round.

Nearby Points of Interest: The American Hotel, Sag Harbor Whaling Museum, The Beacon, and Bay Street Theater.

Beach and Bay Bungalows are located on Dune Road in Westhampton Beach. The Bungalows have just reopened two years ago after extensive renovations as the former Beehive Bungalows.

The Bungalows sleep between four and six guests. These bayside bungalows include a bedroom, bathroom, kitchen, deck, BBQ space, sunroom, and more. Outdoor amenities include a cooler, outdoor shower, and patio furniture.

Inside, guests have the comfort of air conditioning, heating, hot water, full kitchen amenities like a refrigerator, oven, dishes and silverware, and more. Complimentary Wi-Fi, and parking are also available. Bicycles are available for exploring the Westhampton Beach neighborhood.

Beach and Bay Bungalows is open seasonally through mid-October.



The waterfront resort is also home to an onsite restaurant named Sí Sí that transport guests to their favorite coastal Mediterranean getaway. The restaurant also boasts one of the Hamptons' best sunset view. The menu delivers a classic but innovative take on renowned cuisine from the likes of Italy, Spain, Greece, Morocco and Turkey.

Shou Sugi Ban House

Shou Sugi Ban House is set far back from Montauk Highway in Water Mill, just outside the town of Southampton. This wabi-sabi inspired wellness retreat and destination spa that incorporates many forms of wellness ranging from sound healing to reiki to yoga to hikes on the beach.

Overnight retreats at any one of Shou Sugi Ban House's thirteen rooms include a daily morning movement

class, signature breakfast and access to the saltwater swimming pool, Main Barn lounge with fireplace and reading library, fire lounge, movement pavilion, solarium deck, and cherry orchard.


The signature breakfast menu includes seasonal porridge, miso soup, farm raised soft-boiled eggs, house-made granola, chia seed pudding with oat milk, and more.

Each room accommodates between one and two guests and features either a king or queen bed with views of the saltwater pool. In-room amenities include Organic Sasawashi slippers, a nightly in-room seasonal soak, signature Shou Sugi Ban House soaps, sustainable bamboo toothbrushes, in-room safe, and much more.

Nearby Points of Interest: The Watermill Center, Parrish Art Museum, Duck Walk Vineyards, and <u>Hampton Coffee Company</u>.

The Roundtree

The 15-room seaside boutique hotel has a rustic and refined design inspired by nature in its historic cottages and barn. Hotel and cottage guests can expect 2 acres of landscaped luscious gardens perfect for daytime

picnics or BBQ dinners, luxurious amenities, and more.

Conveniently located on Main Street, The Roundtree is easily accessible from the Hampton Jitney stop and less than a mile from the Long Island Railroad. Formerly known as Gansett Green Manor, The Roundtree is a short walk from the ocean, restaurants, boutique shops, and historic landmarks.

The Roundtree Hotel is also kid friendly. Nightly s'mores, lawn games, and beach toys are some of several amenities offered for their youngest guests.

Guests of The Roundtree Hotel may also take part in curated signature experiences, for an additional cost. These include a private tour of the Parrish Art Museum, a guided walking tour of Amagansett, a beach bonfire, or cooking class to name a few.

The 1708 House

The 1708 House is a refined bed and breakfast on Main Street in Southampton Village, located within an easy walking distance of several notable shops, restaurants, museums, and art galleries.

The 1708 House is open year-round and boasts a collection of stunning 18 century styled rooms and suites. Amenities may include a private bath, exposed beams, and a tub and shower combination. There are also three cottages onsite. A continental breakfast is served each morning.

The 1770 House

The 1770 House is located in the heart of East Hampton Village's historic district on Main Street. This stunning 18th century colonial house is home to a year-round boutique bed and breakfast and restaurant.

The elegant restaurant and downstairs cozy tavern both serve New American cuisine filled with local bounty. The menu is created by Executive Chef Michael Rozzi. The 250-bottle wine list is overseen by Wine Director Michael Cohen.

The luxurious B&B has six guestrooms and a two-level carriage house with old-fashioned comforts and modern conveniences.

Nearby Points of Interest: Guild Hall, Ladies Village Improvement Society, Main Beach, and Round Swamp Farm.

Topping Rose House

Topping Rose House is located on the corner of Main Street and the Bridgehampton/Sag Harbor Turnpike and is considered to be one of the very best hotels in the Hamptons. This year-round luxurious boutique resort offers 16 spacious contemporary guestrooms and six one-bedroom suites. Amenities in each room include Frette linens, bathrobes by SFERRA, and bath amenities by Farmaesthetics.

Their onsite restaurant, Jean-Georges at Topping Rose House has a New American, farm-to-table menu. Their dishes are crafted using local ingredients sourced from the area's fisherman and farms. The restaurant serves breakfast, lunch, and dinner year-round, and brunch on the weekends.

The hotel also has a heated outdoor pool, poolside cocktail service during the summer season, fitness classes, spa services, and regular events from rosé and champagne parties to poolside parties during the summer months.

Nearby Points of Interest: Children's Museum of the East End, South Fork Natural History Museum & Nature Center, Open Minded Organics, and Channing Daughters Winery.
